
Conclusion:

Contractual Services Agreement

This agreement made at Mumbai on this Monday day of 22.08. 2022 between:

Pratham Education Foundation, a company registered under section 8 of the Companies Act 2013 with its office located in New Delhi, at 8-4/58, 2nd Floor, Safdarjung Enclave, New Delhi- 110029 (hereinafter called "Pratham") of the one part, and

Subhas R. Girde (hereinafter called "Contractor"), having PAN: AGXPG2111K with his address at post-Karala, Taluka- Anjngaon, district- Amravati of the other part and collectively known as "Parties".

AND WHEREAS "Contractor" will conduct activities related to the Annual Status of Education Report (ASER) 2022 in Chandrapur district, Maharashtra State from 12th September to 15th October using their own manpower and handover the collected data to Pratham and in return Pratham has agreed to provide contractual fees of Rs. 57,000/- (Rupees "Fifty-Seven Thousand" only), inclusive of all applicable statutory taxes, to undertake and complete the survey on its behalf on the following terms and conditions.

NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH and it is mutually agreed upon by and between the parties hereto under:

Pratham and "Contractor" hereby mutually agree and declare as under:

BASIC UNDERSTANDING

- Pratham and "Contractor" mutually acknowledge the legal autonomy of each other, registered as they are under their respective laws;
- B. ASER Centre is a research wing of Pratham.
- C. Both parties are mutually willing to define and identify their respective responsibilities and liabilities, through the instrument of this Agreement and fully abide by the terms and conditions agreed to;
- D. It is understood and agreed that the basic purpose of entering into this Agreement is to complete ASER 2022 by "Contractor". If, for any reason, it is later found that this purpose is not being realized, then Pratham would be at liberty to terminate the agreement after giving 2 weeks written notice of the same. Detailed list of "Deliverable for both the parties" is being attached with this contract as "Annexure 1".
- E. It is understood and accepted that Pratham and "Contractor" will work with families & communities to achieve the desired objective in the selected geographical area.
- F. Since "Contractor" or its employees/workers/representatives are required to interact with the children, a Child Protection Declaration is to be taken from every employees/workers/representatives who will be directly involved with the children being surveyed "Contractor" will ensure that the declaration is taken
